

ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES APRIL 16, 2025

<u>Call to order</u>: President George Hall initiated the meeting at 7:00 pm, underlining the significance of maintaining decorum throughout the session.

Present: See attached Board Member sign-in.

<u>Reading of Annual Meeting April 15, 2024, minutes:</u> Secretary Deana Jackson read the minutes in her official capacity. President George Hall proposed their acceptance, which was seconded by Tammy Klotz and approved by the general membership.

Discussion: The topic of the bylaws, particularly using the term 'pig' and its implications, sparked a lively and important discussion. President George Hall reminded everyone of the <u>Restrictive Covenants, Article</u> <u>VI: USE RESTRICTIONS, A4: No hogs shall be kept on any of the lots within the subdivision, nor shall any animal be kept on any lot that causes nuisance or annoyance because of noise or smell.</u> He then reread the special meeting minutes, which included information regarding hogs in the neighborhood. President George Hall requested approval to accept those minutes as they were read. Brenda Ciccarelli motioned to approve, and the motion carried, underscoring the significance of this discussion.

<u>Website</u>: available to post information/articles, for example, if a member has a company or uses one they would recommend, etc. Brenda Ciccarelli mentioned that other information could be posted as well. Please submit items you would like posted.

Discussion by Parcel: Kirby Brown questioned why clay was spread down the main road. President George Hall reported that the county did not adequately fulfill the HOA request and did not lay down a mix of sand and clay. It was asked if the county would provide a refund since it was done improperly. President George Hall shared that Mike Buckley has been working to try to get discounted road gradings as a possibility. President George Hall stated it was understood that it did not turn out as ordered/intended, and it took way too long for the project to start from the time we paid the county for the work.

<u>Question</u>: Is HOA liable due to road conditions if a car wrecks? Referring to a video posted of vehicles driving recklessly. Brenda Ciccrelli spoke to the Sheriff's department at length regarding that situation. Residents should call and report it, and give them time to come out and observe. President George Hall said the situation was a speeding problem, not a road maintenance issue. Janet Walker called the Sheriff's department after seeing the video, and the LCSO has come out since her call.



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Report of Managers:

Webmaster: Please send in content or vendor recommendations.

Treasurer: Finance report submitted. Balance of \$600.00 through March 31st. There are a lot of recurring expenses: liens, mailings, road maintenance, etc. Lien discussion: the first assessment dues notice is outlined in ARTICLE IX – ASSESSMENTS of the BYLAWS. The second notice is the notice of meeting/dues notice that is mailed to each member to their address that is on record with the county (or written request to the secretary to have correspondence sent to a different address). The third is a courtesy notice mailed out per ARTICLE IX – ASSESSMENTS of the BYLAWS. No further notice is warranted; if an individual has a specific issue, they can come to a meeting and discuss.

Vice Pres: No report

Secretary Deana Jackson: Mentioned Eva Vickers, who, during divorce, realized the ex was not paying the HOA dues and would like to make payments. President George Hall would rather see payments than no attempts to pay; however, it would be a board decision, not an individual officer's decision. Lori Andrews mentioned that she is unsure if a neighbor is getting mail and will check with them.

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Budget: Tractor Maintenance (needs hydraulic repair) \$1500.00, Insurance to operate tractor \$1000.00, Administrative Costs; Lori Andrews recommends \$1000.00. President George Hall countered \$500.00. City of Tallahassee road light bill averages \$40-50.00 per month. Road Maintenance/County grading with President George Hall recommends spending as much money as possible on the road. As much funding as possible is needed for legal issues if they arise.

New Business: Janet Walker brought up rules regarding junk in members' yards. Lori Andrews mentioned junk cars, President George Hall stated the county will come to tow vehicles like that, and it was brought up that there could be a fee for removal. President George Hall brought up the Neighborhood Public Awareness Group and invite them to come to a meeting.
